Agency History

The Capri Community Film Society (CCFS) was organized in 1983 to save Montgomery's only remaining neighborhood theater as an operating movie house. Constructed in 1941 in an Art Deco style, the Clover Theater served as the neighborhood theater for the Cloverdale area. Purchased by locally owned Moffitt Theaters in 1948, the Clover, located at 1045 E. Fairview, was renamed the Capri in 1963. In 1979, the Capri was leased to Martin Theaters, a part of the Carmike Theater chain, and operated until 1983 when the CCFS assumed the lease. During the early 1980s, the Capri operated as an adult movie house.

With the demographic changes occurring in the city during the 1970s and with the emergence of the Carmike chain as the major theater group in

town, the Capri operated under a severe financial handicap. Coupled with police and city official pressure to close the adult theater operations, the fate of the theater was in question by 1982.

As concern over the fate of the Capri grew, a group of individuals interested in the preservation of the theater and its continued operation as a movie house met to discuss ways to save the structure. An organizational meeting attended by 33 individuals interested in saving the Capri was held February 2nd, 1983. After a general discussion, it was proposed that the Capri Community Film Society be formed as a non-profit organization to operate the theater by showing art and other non-commercial style films. Led by Randall Williams, the Society incorporated February 23rd, 1983. The mission statement for the Society declared that it would seek "to provide Montgomery with interesting movies, [and to] educate the general public to film making as an authentic art." Negotiations with Moffit Theaters, Martin Theaters, and the local district attorney's office resulted in the Society assuming the lease for the theater. The Society began operations by showing two films during the summer months and held an official opening gala on September 17th with a showing of "The Prince and the Showgirl."

The Film Society is a volunteer organization, led by a 15 member Board headed by a president elected by the members of the Society. Presidents of the Society have been:

To operate the theater and to coordinate the booking and scheduling of films, the Society initially hired temporary administrators. Hilda Dent and Elizabeth Samuel served as temporary directors of the theater in 1983. Beginning in January of 1984, Joy Simkins was hired as the Society's first permanent administrator for the Capri. Simkins left in 1985 and was replaced by Martin McCaffery. The administrator is directly responsible for the daily operations of the theater, including publicity and public outreach, and reports to the Film Society Board. Films are recommended by an advisory committee made up of interested members of the Society, with final decisions resting with the Board and the administrator.

As a non-profit agency, the Society is unique in that it is the only non-profit film society outside of New York that operates its own theater. In order to operate the theater, the Society raises funds through memberships in the Society, donations and grants from local businesses and the state humanities council, and an annual fundraising event, the Gala. With its emphasis upon showing artistic films, the Society suffers a precarious financial condition.

Frequently indebted, the annual Gala provides an infusion of cash to maintain operations. While many films lose money based upon their rental fees and the income from ticket sales for their showings, some films such as the controversial "The Last Temptation of Christ" raised a significant amount of revenue over expenses.

Scope and Contents

This collection contains the record of daily operations for the Capri Community Film Society and the Capri Theater, operated by the Society. Records include minutes of Board meetings, correspondence, financial and operational records demonstrating the complexities of operating a theater, publicity information for specific films and the theater, licenses, permits, and tax information.

The collection is organized along three basic levels: management, film operations, and finances. The materials include documentation on the organization of the Society, with copies of the Society's constitution and by-laws, and applications to the Internal Revenue Service for 501(c) (3) status as a non-profit organization. The collection lacks significant documentation such as correspondence and minutes of meetings pertaining to the decision to create the Society. Also missing is documentation between the Society, Martin Theaters, and the Montgomery County District Attorney's office relating to the Society's assumption of the lease for the Capri Building.

Of interest are the files documenting film attendance, correspondence relating to the showing of the film "The Last Temptation of Christ", petitions against the showing of that film, and clippings which document the theater's life as a neighborhood movie house. The clippings also indicate a rather uneasy relationship between the city of Montgomery and the theater, exemplified by the police raid of a private party at the theater.

Minutes from Board meetings are also of interest as they document issues of importance to the Society such as fundraising and public relations. The minutes suffer somewhat from the inconsistency of the various secretaries in terms of style and format, from the occasional failure to date the minutes, and from a failure to detail information regarding areas of dispute amongst board members.

Arrangement

The material is arranged into five series:

Series 1. Management.

This series contains six sub-series dealing with specific aspects of the management of the Capri Community Film Society. Sub-series include records regarding the creation of the Society, the operations of the Board of Directors, Memberships in the Society, Correspondence, and miscellaneous activities, including job descriptions and fundraising. Each sub-series focuses upon specific management or operational functions of the society.

Sub-Series I: Organization, 1983-1987

Folders: 1-10

Includes minutes of the Capri Community Film Society organizational meeting, a mission statement for the Society, articles of incorporation, Internal Revenue Service determination letters, licenses, safety inspection reports, insuring and equipment leasing information. All materials document activities necessary to the opening of the Capri as an operational theater by the Society.

Sub-Series II: Board of Directors, 1983-1992.

Folders: 11-31; Arranged chronologically for Board minutes, then alphabetically by name of Board Committee, and finally by topic.

Includes minutes of the meetings of the Society's Board of Directors and reports by the Board's Finance, Film Advisory, Fundraising, Long Range Planning and Minority Affairs Committees. Other folders include reports to the Board by the theater director, Treasurer's reports, and position papers by Board President Rick Harris concerning changes to the Society's Constitution and By-Laws. Also of note is a folder dealing with the Capri Board controversy. This folder contains clippings relating to criticism Society member concerning operations of the Society.

Sub-Series III: Membership, 1983-1992

Folders 32-40; Arranged by topic.

Note: All personally identifiable membership information is restricted in access for a period of 25 years. Includes both general information of membership drives and specific information on membership rosters. Of note is folder 37 containing proposals by members for society operations.

Sub-Series IV: Correspondence, 1983-1992.

Folders: 41-47; Arranged by type of correspondence.

Includes general correspondence ranging from thanks to the Society for bringing art films to Montgomery to business correspondence complaining about the late payments of bills. Correspondence with the Alabama State

Council on the Arts concerning grant proposals is also included. Of particular interest are anti-pornography petitions submitted to the Capri when it assumed the lease from Martin Theaters. Prior to the Film Society's assumption of the lease, adult films were shown in the theater. Also included in this sub-series are internal memoranda outlining duties, tasks, and policies and procedures for the employees and the theater.

Sub-Series V: Miscellaneous.

Folders: 48-57; Arranged by topic.

Includes documents dealing with stationary design, checklists, job descriptions and resumes, forms, brochures, clippings and articles relating to the Capri. Of particular interest is a folder on the Montgomery Black Film Project and two folders of news clippings on the Capri, including clippings relating to a police raid on a teenage punk rock concert held at the theater.

Sub-Series VI: Fundraising.

Folders: 58-86; Arranged by topic and there under chronologically.

Includes general fundraising information, programs and reports on the Society's main fundraising activity, the Gala. Other information on fundraising can be found in Series 4: Grants.

Series 2. Films.

This series contains three sub-series dealing with the publicity and scheduling information for films shown by the Capri. The film with the greatest notoriety in "The Last Temptation of Christ." The showing of this film in 1989 generated a great deal of controversy in the community over the appropriateness of the showing of the film. Petitions against the exhibiting of the film were sent in by church groups from throughout the entire state.

Sub-Series I: Advertisements.

Folders: 87-98; Arranged by type of advertisement, and there under chronologically.

Includes contracts, correspondence, flyers, press releases and news articles advertising specific films or the Capri Theater generally.

Sub-Series II: Films A-Z.

Folders: 99-302, Arranged alphabetically by film title.

Includes clippings, advertisements, flyers, attendance reports and promotional post cards.

Sub-Sub-Series II 1: The Last Temptation of Christ, 1988-1989.
Folders: 303-318; Arranged by type of material.

Includes publicity flyers, articles, clippings, correspondence and petitions concerning the controversial film. Among the items of interest is correspondence from the attorney from the American Family Association, representing the Reverend Donald Wildmon, threatening suit against Capri Director Martin McCaffery for comments against Reverend Wildmon and the AFA's actions protesting the showing of the film.

Sub-Series III: Programming.
Folders: 319-353; Arranged by type of material and there under chronologically.

Materials include membership film polls, film orders, confirmation invoices and tracking forms which document the ordering, shipping and receiving of films.

Series 3. Special Programs.

Folders: 354-365; Arranged alphabetically by name of event or performer.

Includes flyers, brochures, press releases and reimbursement request forms for various special (non-film) events such as concerts.

Series 4. Grants, 1984-1990.

This series contains two sub-series, the first dealing with general information concerning grants and the second dealing with information on a specific grant project, The Southern Film Circuit.

Sub-Series I: Grant Applications.
Folders: 366-379; Arranged alphabetically by granting organization and there under chronologically.

Materials include applications, proposal drafts, correspondence, evaluations and reports for specific projects, most notably the Southern Film Series.

Sub-Series II: Southern Circuit, 1985-86.
Folders: 380-381; Arranged chronologically.

Includes publicity releases and correspondence from the South Carolina Arts Commission, coordinator of the grant project. The Southern Film Circuit promotes independent video artists and their works.

Sub-Series II.1: Southern Circuit Directors.

Folders: 382-416; Arranged alphabetically by name of director.

Includes promotional materials and articles on the directors and their works which appear in the Southern Circuit schedule.

Series 5. Financial, 1983-1992.

This series contains eleven sub-series dealing with the Society's fiscal operations.

Sub-Series I: Budgets, 1983-1986.

Folders: 417; Arranged chronologically.

Includes proposed budgets proposed by the Board for the operation of the Capri Theater.

Sub-Series II: Concessions, 1984-1991.

Folders: 418-427; Arranged chronologically by type of report.

Includes cash and concession sales reports for the operation of the concession stand at the theater.

Sub-Series III: Daily Reports, 1985-1990.

Folders: 428-445; Arranged chronologically.

Reports show daily ticket sales activity for films. Reports include revenues per performance and by membership category.

Sub-Series IV: Box Office Reports, 1984-1990.

Folders: 446-515; Arranged chronologically.

Reports include weekly sales totals for numbers of tickets sold, gross sales, percentage of sales due distributor minus amount guaranteed, and the total amount due the distributor for film rental.

Sub-Series V: Cash Receipt Reports, 1984-1987.

Folders: 516-522; Arranged chronologically.

Reports include cash receipts for ticket sales, theater rentals, donations, and other activities.

Sub-Series VI: Deposits, 1983-1991.

Folders: 523-538; Arranged chronologically by type of material.

Includes deposit slips and reports for the various Film Society accounts.

Sub-Series VII: Accounts, 1986-1990.

Folders: 539-548; Arranged chronologically by type of account.

Contains account statements for the Society's general operating account and for the Gala fundraising account.

Sub-Series VIII: Treasurer's Reports 1983-1987.

Folders: 549-554; Arranged chronologically by type of report.

Includes financial reports, income and expenditure projections, and audit statements from the Society's accounting firm.

Sub-Series IX: Taxes, 1983-1991.

Folders: 555-562; Arranged chronologically by governmental body.

Includes correspondence, reports and statements from the Internal Revenue Service, the State of Alabama, and Montgomery County relative to taxes owed by the Capri.

Sub-Series X: Employment, 1986.

Folders: 563-565; Arranged by topic.

Includes a payroll book from 1986 along with information regarding workmen's compensation and unemployment benefits.

Sub-Series XI: Debts.

Folders: 566-576; Arranged alphabetically by vendor.

Includes statements and a promissory note. The majority of the statements are for advertisements placed by the Capri.

Areas addressed were: the membership, its board of directors, general correspondence, and, it also looked into the past, when it was operating as part of the Martin Theater chain. Finally, it then looked forward, a progressive entity and laid plans to develop the theater into a state-of-the-art independent film house.

Sub-Series 1: Organization 1974-1989

Folders: 1-6

Includes a binder of the Martin Theaters, Inc. operating instructions, the previous owners of the Capri; it consists of the job descriptions of employees and the forms to account for the various operations of the movie house. Another record of importance is the report of a structural inspection of the condition of the Capri's physical plant. Also included is a report of a site visit to the theater by Architect David Lowry, whose work was aimed at bringing the design of the theater facilities up to modern standards.
